## Prudhoe Castle

Prudhoe castle has been continuously occupied for over 900 years, and was built as one of a series of castles along the River Tyne following the Norman conquest of 1066. Originally it was home to the Umfravilles, but was later taken over by the famous Percy family, who restored it.

You can explore the keep, the great hall and the picturesque towered walls which enclose a fine Georgian mansion. It's also a lovely spot for a picnic.
